Budget Priorities - Rep. Will Brownsberger, 24th Middlesex District

Dear Chairman DeLeo,

Thank you for inviting members to submit written statements of budgetary priorities. My priorities are as follows. I have numbered them, but do not mean to rank them.

- 1. Funding of Amelia Earhart Dam Pumping Capacity Study (\$500,000): This project to control destructive flooding is of high importance to several districts. It is addressed in a separate letter from Chairman Paul Donato.
- 2. <u>Increasing Chapter 70 and Special Education Circuit Breaker:</u> I hope that we will be able to follow through on last year's commitment to build over five years to a minimum state contribution of 17.5% of foundation budget for all communities. I also hope that we will be able to fully fund and expand the special education circuit breaker.
- 3. Expanding Property Tax Circuit Breaker: Property taxes per home are well above the statewide average in Belmont and Arlington, yet these towns are both economically diverse -- many people on limited incomes are over-burdened by the property tax.
- 4. <u>Public Housing Operating Subsidy (7004-9005):</u> State funded public housing across my district is in noticeably degraded condition. I ask for an overall increase in operating funds and for the following <u>earmarks</u> (either in 7004-9005 or in 7004-0099) to address long standing glaring problems:
 - \$125,000 for the design and installation of an elevator at the Waverley Oaks elderly/disabled apartments in Belmont;
 - \$150,000 to insulate the 100 apartments (25 buildings) at the Belmont Village family development.
- 5. Broad Expansion of Funding for DCR and DEP. Parks and environmental protection appear to be badly under-funded at this time. Many parks in my district and elsewhere are in poor condition and worthy improvement proposals have remained unfunded. Funding cuts have also weakened enforcement. I hope that we are able to make across-the-board progress in restoring these areas.
- 6. Funding of Acquisition of Silver Maple Forest (\$6,000,000): See House Original Docket Number 1511, legislation filed to fund a joint state and local acquisition of a property to be managed by DCR -- acquisition of this property will benefit the entire region by preserving a locally unique eco-system for quiet enjoyment.

- 7. Expansion of Massachusetts Rental Voucher Program (7004-9024): Increase of \$10.8 million to \$38,283,345. This program is essential to addressing the failure of the housing market to generate moderate income housing. It is particularly important in the greater Boston area where housing is expensive.
- 8. Expansion of METCO Funding (7010-0012): Increased funding specifically including cost-escalation language to reflect continually rising costs and funding for transportation, especially to include late transportation for children participating in after-school activities.
- 9. <u>Stabilization of Services for GLBT Domestic Violence Victims (4513-1130):</u> with language that "not less than \$658,000 shall be expended for the public health model of community engagement and intervention services and crisis housing for sexual violence and intimate partner violence in the GLBT community."
- 10. <u>Expansion of Certain Targeted Programs</u>. The following additional programs have emerged as high priorities in my conversations with constituents and I hope that we will able to grant them substantial increases:
 - 0321-1600, Massachusetts Legal Assistance Corporation
 - 0321-2100, Massachusetts Correctional Legal Services
 - 4406-3000, Services for Homeless Individuals (with new language for supporting permanent housing)
 - 4510-0106, Commission on End of Life Care
 - 4590-1503, Pediatric Palliative Care Program
 - 5046-1000, Geriatric Mental Health Services
 - 7004-3026, Housing Consumer Education Centers;
 - 7004-xxxx, Moving to Economic Opportunity (new pilot program providing rental vouchers while leveraging resources from job support programs in the community).
 - 7061-9626, Massachusetts YouthBuild Coalition
 - 9110-1640, Geriatric Mental Health
 - Affordable Housing Trust Fund
 - Soft Second Mortgage Program

I would be very grateful for any consideration that you can give to these priorities.
