Additional Organizations and Online Resources

<u>Right on Crime</u> is a project of the Texas Public Policy Foundation that raises awareness of effective criminal justice reforms within the conservative movement. Review the project's <u>Statement of Principles</u>.

The <u>Council of State Governments Justice Center</u> provides practical, nonpartisan advice and consensus-driven strategies to increase public safety and strengthen communities. Current projects include:

- The <u>Justice Reinvestment Initiative</u> provides technical assistance to states to implement justice reinvestment strategies and produce publications on the work being done in those states.
- The <u>National Reentry Resource Center</u> provides education, training and technical assistance on prison reentry under the Second Chance Act of 2007.

The John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation's <u>Safety and Justice Challenge</u> provides support jurisdictions across the country seeking to build more just and effective local justice systems that improve public safety, save taxpayer money, and yield more fair outcomes.

The <u>Laura and John Arnold Foundation</u> seek to promote lasting, systemic change at the front end of the criminal justice system. The Foundation is committed to pursuing research and developing tools to ensure the system is effective in protecting the public, minimizing crime, making wise use of public resources, and administering justice fairly and efficiently. The Foundation has published results of <u>four pretrial studies</u>.

Public Welfare Foundation's <u>Criminal Justice program</u> seeks to establish more effective and fairer criminal justice policies and institutions throughout the nation.

<u>Urban Institute's Justice Policy Center</u> conducts research and evaluations to improve justice policy and practice at the national, state, and local levels. Among other projects, Urban conducts <u>data analysis</u> of states involved with justice reinvestment.

<u>The Vera Institute of Justice's Center on Sentencing and Corrections</u> works with government leaders to advance safe, fair and effective criminal justice policies.

- The <u>Cost-Benefit Analysis Unit</u> performs cost-benefit analyses and other cost-related studies, provides assistance to jurisdictions conducting their own studies and carries out research to advance the knowledge of cost-benefit analysis, including the <u>Cost-Benefit Knowledge Bank</u>.
- <u>Technical assistance</u> is provided under the Justice Reinvestment Initiative.

Resources from the <u>Bureau of Justice Statistics</u> in the <u>Office of Justice Programs</u> of the <u>U.S. Department of</u> <u>Justice</u> include criminal justice statistics related to crime, criminal offenders, victims of crime, and the operation of justice systems.

• Current work includes the <u>Prisoner Recidivism Analysis Tool</u> that allows users to explore the recidivism patterns of those involved with the criminal justice system.

<u>Results First</u> is an initiative of <u>The Pew Charitable Trusts</u> and the <u>John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur</u> <u>Foundation</u>, with additional support from the <u>Annie E. Casey Foundation</u>, to help states assess the costs and benefits of policy options, and use that data to make decisions based on results.
